

MUSINGS BY THE EDITOR

"...Al-Anon is a microcosm of the larger society within which we exist. Problems found in the outside world can also make their way into the rooms of Al-Anon. As we strive to share in a spirit of trust, both at meetings and individually with our Personal and Service Sponsors and other Al-Anon members, it is reasonable for each member to expect a meaningful level of safety. Those attending Al-Anon meetings benefit other members and themselves when they provide a safe environment in which families and friends of alcoholics can focus on gaining and maintaining serenity. The group can then fulfill its primary purpose—to help families and friends of alcoholics...

Al-Anon's Third Tradition states in part, 'The only requirement for membership is that there be a problem of alcoholism in a relative or friend.' This brings an openness that helps define our character as a diverse fellowship; however, some people come into Al-Anon without an understanding of the type of behavior that is appropriate in meetings or in the company of other members. A person can find serenity in Al-Anon and yet still not understand what is acceptable behavior..."

I went to a meeting some time ago, and a member asked "What was I doing there? Who was my alcoholic?" I was hurt by my cousin's question. From this I learned not to ask inappropriate questions.
