I knew the other two speakers on the panel which was comforting. I was also happy to be the middle speaker, not first or last. Someone could "clean up" after me if needed.

I was supposed to talk for 20 minutes. I didn't plan ahead enough and only spoke for 10 minutes until I couldn't think of what more to say.

It was over! I did the best I could. But boy would I do it differently next time! I would prepare better, and jot down a few notes. Lo and behold my next opportunity came just a month later. I was approached by a moderator on a panel that one of his speakers couldn't make it and could I step up. After a brief shock I was excited to have a second chance at what I thought I messed up the last time.

This time I found a quiet place to gather my thoughts and write some notes. I had a friend look me in the eye and tell me "You got this, you're going to be fine". And it was!

After speaking I feel like I am understanding my story better and that I am starting to really understand that alcoholism is a baffling, cunning disease.

I am feeling more confident, stronger and happier these days. I am grateful to have had the opportunity to do service in Al Anon and grateful for how much it has helped me grow.
