"The GR's in the district elect the DR. The DR assists the Delegate in passing on information about World Service Office (WSO) activities and World Service Conference (WSC) decisions to the GRs in the district."

Members from international service structures also contribute by offering their valuable interpretation skills during regularly scheduled meetings with WSO Staff, which often include members who do not speak English. When this is the case, a multilingual member from the country with whom we are meeting steps up and translates for their non-English-speaking members as well as for the WSO Staff, so that together we can support the international growth of Al-Anon and Alateen.

- 16, 500 responses in summer of 2021
- 86% women, 12% men, .6% not identifying
- Average age 61-average first meeting 44
- 99% high school or more
- 83% reported improvement in mental health in the first year
- Individuals concerned about someone's drug addiction are welcome to attend Al-Anon to determine if it's right for them, with the understanding that our program focuses on alcoholism. Survey results indicated that 28% of members first came to Al-Anon because of a drug problem in a relative or friend. Al-Anon members also seek help from other resources when needed, for concerns in addition to or other than someone else's drinking. 30% of members also consider or have considered themselves a member of other recovery programs, including A.A


