Al-Anon meeting at the Monroe County Jail continues in process. Dennis has asked for volunteers at several meetings he attends. Response has been scarce. Dennis has spoken with the Director of the program, initial request was for Men's rehab unit. Most of respondents have been women. If this continues to be true, Jail will accept this. What needs to be clear to anyone volunteering to help with this endeavor is commitment to this project must be steadfast. There are processes volunteers will need to go through and Jail schedules cannot be manipulated to suit individual needs.

John L. Norris Clinic informational meeting continues to meet bi-weekly. There are four Al-anon members who have supported this meeting for the last three years.

Beginner's meetings in the Rochester area continue to meet regularly, Wednesday at 11:00am and Saturday at 11:30am.

Newcomer packets continue to be sent as requests come into AIS. It has been observed that newcomer packet requests have been much fewer than last year (2024). For this same period 65 packets were mailed out, and this year 21 packets have been mailed.

Al-Anon volunteer visits Jennifer House on the second Monday of the month. Cathy KP is currently the Volunteer, our thanks for her service.
